

Our Saviour Physical Education

As stated in the handbook, the Our Saviour Physical Education program is based on participation/effort, behavior, and skill level. Participation/Effort and behavior will have a greater impact on a student's grade than skill level. Students will be introduced to a variety of age/grade appropriate skills, games, sports and activities.

All students, grades K-8, are required to have a clean pair of tennis shoes for indoor P.E. classes. This requirement begins on September 9th. In addition, it is recommended that students in grades K-5 wear a different pair of tennis shoes to school on their scheduled P.E. days (see below) to accommodate outdoor P.E. classes. Dress shoes worn for outdoor P.E. classes can create discomfort and safety issues. Shoes must be worn at all times in P.E. classes (unless otherwise instructed by the teacher.) **2019-20 Schedule:**

All students, grades 5-8, are required to dress out for P.E. classes. Appropriate (see school handbook), comfortable clothing needs to worn for all P.E. classes. If P.E. clothes are not needed, students will be informed in advance. In addition, it is recommended that 5th -8th students have a secondary pair of tennis shoes for outdoor P.E. classes. Again, students will be informed in advance (when possible) if P.E. will be outside. The requirement of P.E. clothes and shoes begins on Sept. 9th.

Any student unable to participate in class due to injury, illness, etc. will still receive a P.E. grade. Students with participation limitations will be used as scorekeepers, umpires, referees, etc. Finally, a student in grades 5-8 who fails to dress out for P.E. classes will see a negative impact on his/her P.E. grade. Each student will get 1 free "no dress" per quarter. Each additional no dress will lower a student's grade up to one full letter grade. At the end of each quarter, academic make-up assignments will be available to students with more than one "no-dress." However, academic make-up assignments will be limited to two assignments per student. Thus, if a student has more than 3 "no dresses" in one quarter, the highest P.E. grade they will earn for the quarter will be a B.
